### L.A.C.E. History

Lacemakers and Collectors Exchange (L.A.C.E.) held its first meeting in September 1990, and its first lace day the following month. Annual lace days followed until 1995, when the reorganization of the guild took place:

- 1. Bylaws were re-written to conform to the rules of International Old Lacers Inc.
- 2. Roberts Rules of Order was acknowledged as the Parliamentary Authority.
- 3. A copy of the original charter was issued, confirming L.A.C.E. as a chartered group with continuous history from 1992.

Monthly meetings, lace fairs, vendor days, lace exhibits, member-taught workshops and special-event workshops taught by expert teachers from outside our area characterize the guild's activities. Publications include a quarterly newsletter and a website.


