

NOVEMBER 2019 WORKSHOP WITH KUMIKO NAKAZAKI

Goal: To provide a learning experience and collegial opportunity in the area of mixed lace and drawing for the members of CALM

Dates – November 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 2019 (Friday through Tuesday)

Hours 9 AM – 4 PM with one hour lunch at approximately noon

Cost: \$200.00. A down payment of \$50.00 (checks should be made payable to CALM) is to be paid to Workshop Chairman, Mary Lou Koval. Subsequent payments may be made during the summer months **with the final payment due by August 1st 2019. Cost per non-member = \$215.**

IF THE WORKSHOP IS NOT FILLED BY CALM MEMBERS ON APRIL 1ST, THE WORKSHOP WILL BE OPENED TO OTHER GUILDS. CALM MEMBERS MAY STILL ENROLL BUT THEY WILL NO LONGER HAVE PRECEDENCE OVER NON-MEMBERS OF CALM..

There will be two directions to this workshop:

1. One will concentrate on Designing Binche. This group will not be using lace pillows or bobbins. They will need pencils, colored pencils, colored pens, regular black pens, snowflake paper, Calque paper (25 lb minimum and 50 lb preferred), really good rulers, triangles, mirrors, and A REALLY BIG ERASER! Honestly, you DO NOT have to be an artist to sign up for this workshop!

2. The other direction you may take will include your lace pillow and bobbins. You will be working at your own pace on a design in one of the Continental Laces. Kumiko specializes in Binche, Flanders, Duchesse, Bloomwork. She also teaches Chrysanthemum, Florentine and Beveren and Bayeux and Chantilly.

At this time, we don't have Kumiko's travel details so I can't tell you when she will arrive. If possible have your type of lace picked out, pattern picked out and prepared and pricked. If the thread you want to use is different from what is called for, then you will need to either enlarge or reduce your pattern before preparing it. You will want to have enough bobbins wound so that you can start your pattern the first day. But if your pattern needs 200 bobbins, you don't have to have them all wound ahead of the first day. Workshop chairman will try to help you if you have questions.

Kumiko will hopefully be arriving early enough on the day before the workshop that she can consult with you. But we can't count on it. So think it through, try to problem solve as much as possible so that you can use your time efficiently when in class. Once we learn Kumiko's schedule, and appointments are feasible, the workshop

chairman will make a schedule for those interested in consulting with Kumiko. Stay tuned in on this subject until we hear from our teacher.

GENERAL INFORMATION FOR ALL WORKSHOPS

Calm Workshops take place at the home of Mary Lou Koval, 1680 Cahill Drive in East Lansing. Her telephone number is: (517) 337-2447. You are welcome to share a buffet lunch with dessert for \$6.00 per day, or you may bring a lunch. If you are counting calories and prefer not to have dessert, the cost is \$5.00 per day.
